No. 22 .- The complainant has fur ther to state that although there has been a general order published by His Excellency the Commander of the Forces in the Summer of 1813, wherein it directs, that the Royal Newfoundland Regiment was to be duly paid off, and its interior economy and discipline preserved, yet this general order as far as regards the payment of the Regiment has been in many instances disobeyed, to the manifest injury of the complainant, whilst doing duty on board His Majesty's Brig the Earl of Moira, and that the complainant's Regimental pay has been withheld from him, during the periods between the 25th of August and the 2nd of December, 1813.


