





> WASHINGTON, Aug. 20 .- The Shipping Board to-day sold the American Export Line to the Export Steamshi Corporation of New York City for \$1,062,000. Eighteen vessels were involved and sold at \$7.50 a ton, with guaranteed operations for five years. The vessels ply between New York, Philadelphia and Baltimore and dediterranean and Black Sea ports. It was the last remaining Shipping Board freight line between the Atlan tie Coast and the Black Ser ports. Commenting on this and other sale of the Shipping Boavd, Chairman O'Connor, said:




