No GRAPPLING NONSENSE.

The alleged rescuer did not attempt to grapple for the child, as was said to have been done in the case of the mythical Penn sylvania child who recently fell into a well bore too small to admit a kitten. On the contrary they dug a shaft near the well, and from this newer hole tunnelled toward the imprisoned child. The work in the tunnel, in sand so loose and treacherous that they dared not touch it with pick or shovel,

is said to have been terribly exciting, the workers, burrowing softly with their hands only, being stimulated by the moaning of the child and not overcheered by the pros-pect of a cave-in that would bury them alive Too Previous.

The first tunnel struck thei bore too far The first tunnel struck thei bore too far above the place where the child was, so a second shaft was dug from the tunnel itself, and the child was rescued alive and apparently uninjured, although it had been all the while so doubled that its head, which fortunately did not go down first, was pressed against the lower joints of the legs. Hundreds of people were about the mouth of the shaft when the rescuers reached the surface with their precious burden and faint.
