Creamed Onions-Peel one quart of medium-sized white onions, place them in a saucepan and cover with boi water. Boil till nearly done, and then add one teaspoonful salt. After boiling them a few minutes longer drain them in a colander. In the meantir half a tablespoonful of flour, stir and hot milk, cook two minutes. season with white pepper and a sprinkle of salt. Put the onions in a hot dish and pour the sauce over them.

Potato Timbale-Pare eight goodsized potatoes, cover them with boiling water and let them cook thirty Drain the water and mash the potatoes smooth and light. Add three tablespoonfuls of butter, two of finely chopped parsley, some salt and pepper, and then gradually beat into them one cup of hot milk. Stir hard, and at last add three well beaten eggs. Butter an oval tin basin and cover thickly with fine crumbs. with the prepared potato and bake in a moderate oven half an hour. Let the dish stand a few minutes after i comes from the oven, then place heated platter over the top of the basin, and turn them over together Press the tin to loosen the sides, and lift it gently from the timbale.
