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QUIZ DEPUTY ON PENSION POLICY

Dominion United Veterans Present Application To Committee On Re-establishment.

Col. Arthur Requests Information Regarding Rights of Sick Soldier.

OTTAWA, April 11.—An application on behalf of the Grand Army of United Veterans by its secretary, J. F. Marsh, was made this morning before the standing committee on pensions and re-establishment. It was stated by Brig.-General Ross that there was to be a meeting tomorrow of the G. A. U. V. and the G. W. V. A. with a view as to representation. It was decided, on motion by Col. Arthur, to defer until next meeting of the committee the application of Secretary Marsh and also the application made by the G. W. V. A. and the Imperial Veterans in Canada.

The first witness heard was N. F. Parkinson, deputy minister of the department of soldiers' civil re-establishment.

Asked whether the machinery of the department was satisfactory, Mr. Parkinson stated that the government had never been limited in carrying out policy. He illustrated this by saying that the department had been freed from control by the civil service commission. The existing legislation was sufficient, except where moneys were needed to carry out new policies.

He outlined the procedure in cases where soldiers apply for assistance.

Not at Our Expense. Col. Arthur asked if the applicant might be advised of his right of appeal, when notified that his application is rejected.

"That is quite possible," answered the witness.

Gen. Ross asked if the department did not bring a man to Ottawa, if he appealed. "Not at our expense," was the reply, "unless we think he has a good case."

In reply to further questions, Mr. Parkinson stated that when the departmental doctor reported a claim the applicant was required to provide independent medical evidence as to his condition before he was re-examined by the department. W. G. Raymond, Brantford, asked whether there had not been recently received many applications for gratuity showing that the veterans did not know of their rights.

Mr. Parkinson said that gratuities were under the department of militia. He could not answer.

Under Close Supervision. In reply to further questions the witnesses stated that every effort was made to diagnose the condition of applicants, even to sending them to hospitals and keeping them under close supervision.

"Will you accept the report of a civilian doctor and give the patient a re-examination?" asked Donald Sutherland.

"That is the basis for our future action," was the reply.

When a man's claim is rejected, asked Chairman Marler, are you influenced by the report of your unit which has rejected the claim, or do you err on the side of the soldier? "Up to the present," was the answer, "we have erred on the side of the soldier."

"Has the applicant any further appeal?" again asked Mr. Marler. "Yes, if he brings further medical evidence."

"Unfortunately that policy has not been carried out," interjected W. F. Carrol, Cape Breton S. "I know of half a dozen cases of men in hospital, where the civilian doctor has sent in a report and the letters have never been answered."

Gen. Clark asked whether the right of appeal for examination was not limited to a year. "No, sir."

"Well," said Gen. Clark, "I have never seen a case when a man was discharged fit and his claim was admitted after a year."

"What is the time limit within which applications must be made under the act?" asked Chairman Marler.

"There is no limit for treatment for war disability," answered the deputy minister.

SPANIARDS BOMB REBEL VILLAGES

MADRID, April 11.—Renewed activity by Spanish aviators in the operations against the Moroccan rebels is reported in an official statement which recounts the bombing of the villages in the vicinity of Velez de La Gomera. The village of Casero was set afire by bombs. Both land and seaplanes took part in the raid.

The surrender of additional rebel chiefs is reported.
