Notice is hereby given that an application will be made by the Board of Governors of Western University, London, Ontario, to the Legislature of the Province of Ontario at its next session for an amending Act to its Act of Incorporation, 8th Edward VII, ch. 2.

1. To change the name of the university to "The University of Western Ontario."
2. To authorize the City of London continue to make grants to the university without obtaining the assent of ratepayers.
3. To authorize the council of the county or municipality in Western

4. To provide for the appointment of an official visitor.
5. To authorize the university commissions to consist of the chancellor, the board of governors, the senate, the officers, faculty, graduates and under-graduates of the university and the official head of

6. To constitute the Board of Governors as follows: During the time the City of London continues its annual grants to the university the city council shall appoint four governors; the lieutenant-governor of the Province of Ontario shall appoint four governors; and these shall elect four more. The chancellor and the president of the university, the mayor of the city and

(a) To name the officers of the board.

(c) To control the property and business affairs of the university subject to the terms of any trust affecting any monies or properties which may come into possession of the university.

(d) To authorize gifts to the university by individuals or organizations.

(e) To authorize the board to sell or acquire property for the university.

- (e) To provide for proceedings against the board.
- (f) To provide for the establishment of faculties, departments and chairs and to fix fees.
- (g) To arrange for the auditing of accounts.
- (h) To exempt the university from

(j) To exempt all officers, teachers and students from religious tests.

7. To constitute a senate as follows: Two members shall be appointed from each faculty of the university and one from each affiliated college or school.

number. One member may be appointed by the county council and the council of each incorporated city in the following counties: Brant, Brantford, Elgin, Essex, Grey, Huron, Oxford, Lambton, Middlesex, Norfolk, North Perth, Wellington and Waterloo. The principals of the continuation schools, high schools and collegiate institutes

One member shall be appointed by each of the school boards of the City of London. One member may be elected by the graduates of each faculty, one by the graduates of each affiliated college. Certain officers of the university shall be ex-officio members of the senate. Each senator shall hold

(a) To authorize the senate to control the educational policy of the university and with the board to create faculties and establish facilities for teaching any of the arts and sciences. To enable the senate to confer degrees in any department of learning.

with respect to the educational needs of the university constituency and with respect to extension work.

8. To provide for the election of a chancellor.

9. To provide for the affiliation of a college or school in Canada established for teaching divinity, arts, science, medicine, music, engineering, agriculture, or commerce.

(b) To provide for conferring honorary degrees and degrees by examination in divinity.
