THE PERSIAN BORDER TO BE CORDONED—Russian Preparations—Aid for Famine Sufferers.

It May Reach the United States—How Parses Dispose of the Dead.

LONDON, Jan. 22.—The Chronicle's correspondent at Vienna reports, that a Constantinople dispatch says that the Porte has ordered the Persian border to be cordoned in order to exclude the plague.

A special from St. Petersburg says: "The fear of the Indian plague reaching here grows rapidly. The Novoe Vremya says England's permitting the population of the stricken districts to emigrate will soon scatter the plague all over the country."

The Mirvo's Ozlozko says: "Italy, France and Austria have taken precautions. History has shown that Russia is always the country that suffers most from the plague-stricken districts and find out the truth and study the disease, as we cannot rely on proper guard on the English, whose commercial interests have eaten into the humanitarian instincts of all nations."

Calcutta, Jan. 22.—The government has ordered the stoppage after February 1 of all pilgrim traffic from Bombay and Karachi on account of the plague. There are now 1,760,000 persons on the relief works, and about 150,000 are receiving gratuitous relief.
