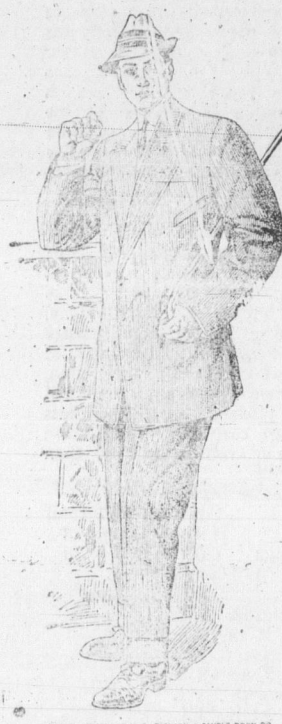

PROGRESS IN MEXICO NOW

New Electoral Law Adopted and Division of Large Estates Promised.

Mexico City, June 1.—The Mexican congress brought its session to a close last night with the appointment of the permanent committee, composed of members of both houses, which will represent the body during the recess. The fall session will begin on Sept. 15.

Among the measures of greatest importance to the people at large taken up by the Congress were the land bill, proposing the division of the great estates throughout the Republic, and the sale of lands in small tracts to settlers, and the electoral law. The land bill went to a committee, and was not reported.

It authorizes the division and sale of such national lands as possess the necessary conditions for distribution in small parcels. The bill also authorizes suitable lands to be acquired from private owners and the construction of irrigation, sanitation and drainage works and transportation lines. It will come up again.

IMPORTING CHILDREN

Halifax, N. S., June 2.—One hundred and seventy-nine bright-eyed youngsters, averaging fourteen years, arrived this morning from the Middlemore Home, Birmingham. They leave Halifax tonight for points in the maritime provinces.

About sixty of the youngsters are girls. All are a healthy looking lot.

Mrs. Gerow, of the Fairview Home, takes a party to Carleton and York counties tonight. Mr. Jackson leaves the same time with a party for Fredericton.

Superintendent Gerow leaves tomorrow with those destined for points between Halifax and St. John. Ensign Hargrove will take a party to Prince Edward Island. The two matrons will take a party to Cape Breton.

His body was found entangled in weeds.

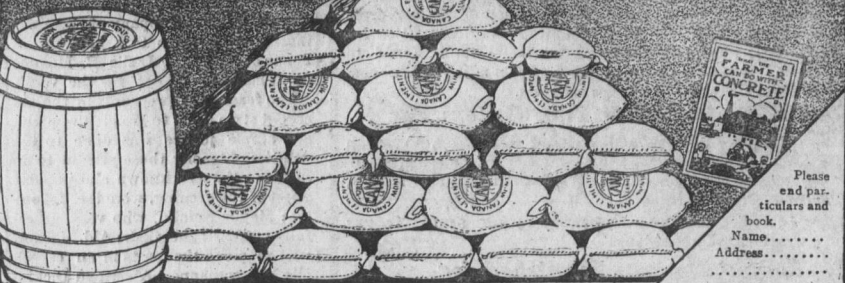
