From the Caterer. The table fork appears to have been introduced into Europe through something like it has been among the rubbish and ruins of the towns. The Jews and Egyptians, using the fork for other purposes, made use of it at the table, and the Greeks used it to eat the kibbles, stirring the fire and to the making of field dishes.
