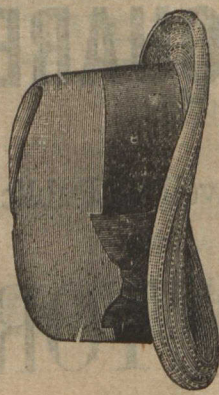

TUESDAY, JULY 21st.

The American visitors will arrive at Cape Vincent on Tuesday afternoon, July 21st, and will be there met by a Committee from the Kingston Branch, who will accompany them to the city.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 22nd.

The Delegations from the C.M.B.A. Branches East and West, are expected to arrive early on Wednesday morning.

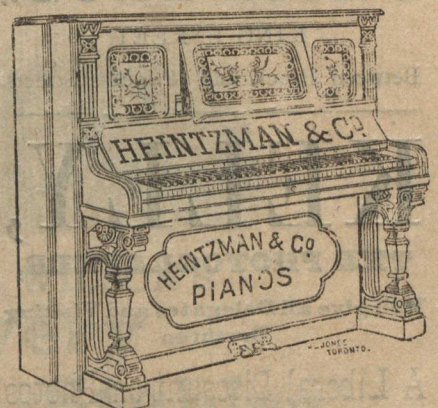
