A Glass of Water at Bedtime.

A hot bath on going to bed, even in the hot nights of summer, is a better reliever of insomnia than many drugs.

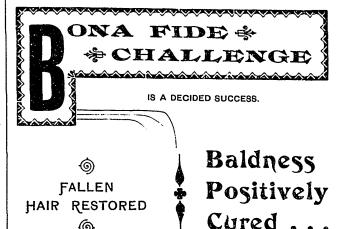

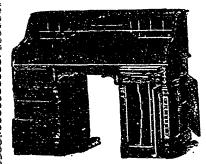

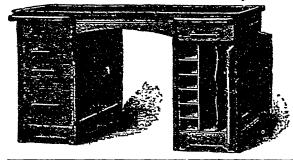
