The highest reading of the Barometer was on the 21st day, and indicated 30.425 inches. The lowest was on the 4th day, and was 29.637, giving a monthly range of 0.788 inches. The highest temperature was on the 18th day, and was $85 \circ 7$. The lowest was on the 11th day, and was $45 \circ 1$. The mean temperature of the month was $63 \circ 83$, which is $5 \circ 33$ higher than the *Isotherm* for Montreal. Rain fell on 12 days, amounting to 2.263 inches, and was accompanied by thunder and lightning on three days. First frost of Autumn was on the 6th day.
