



Half boarders sleep in the House, and are furnished with a bedstend and palliass.

6th. Every month that is commenced must be puid entire without any deduction.

7th. Doctors' Fees and Medecines are of course extra charges.

8th. Lessons in any of the Fine Arts are also extra charges.



the bill of expenses, a bulletin of the health, conduct, assiduity, and improvement of their children.

12th. Each quarter must be paid in advance in bankable money.
