

- MOFERT Minister Zheng Tuobin is to visit New Delhi this autumn.

- Jiang Zemin, General Secretary of the Communist Party has called on leaders of higher-learning institutions to fight bourgeois liberalization. He said the turmoil originated from bourgeois liberalization which began first on the campuses.

HONG KONG

- The Hong Kong Legislative Council has called on the government to inject massive investment in Hong Kong's future by pushing ahead with a series of huge transport infrastructural projects.

- An estimated C\$3.3 billion has been withdrawn from Chinese-owned banks in Hong Kong since June. These withdrawals represent 11% of the banks' deposits.

- In the UK parliamentary debate on Hong Kong, Foreign Secretary Howe called on China to delay the implementation of Basic Law.

TAIWAN

- On July 12, the "People's Daily" said that the Beijing Municipal State Security Bureau deported Peter T. P. Huang of the Taiwan-based "Independence Evening Post."

- Taiwanese investment in ASEAN has soared over the past two years. Japan's Nomura Research Institute predicted that Taiwan would surpass Japan by 1990 to become the largest investor in Southeast Asia.

KOREA/ COREE

- ROK President Roh conducted a partial cabinet shuffle on July 19, replacing seven ministers involved in recent controversies. The shuffle affected Home, Labour, Construction, Health, Communications and the Agency for National Security Planning.

- The governor of the Bank of Korea has estimated South Korea's 1989 economic growth at 7.1%, short of the original target of 8% and below last year's 12.2%.

- The ROK and the USSR opened an official government-to-government channel on July 18, when both sides agreed to set up consular offices in their respective trade offices in Seoul and Moscow.

- Barclays Bank finally reached a wage settlement with employees after a record seventy-nine day strike. Foreign bankers are to form an employers association to counter the combined union efforts.

INDOCHINA/ INDOCHINE

- Le premier ministre japonais et le prince Sihanouk se sont rencontrés à Paris dans le cadre du Sommet économique. Ils ont convenu que l'influence chinoise sur les Khmers Rouges sera un facteur déterminant dans les pourparlers relatifs à la question cambodgienne.
