- Kaplan E.S. <u>American Trade Policy</u>, 1923-1995. Greenwood Press, 1996. Traces the history of US trade policy, arguments for and against protectionism, and a trend towards unilateralism and protectionism since the 1980s.
- Krueger A.O. <u>American Trade Policy: A Tragedy in the Making</u>". American Enterprise Institute, 1995. Examines the shift from reliance on the open multilateral trading system under GATT towards bilateral arrangements or regional agreements, with special reference to NAFTA.
- Krueger A.O. ed. <u>The Political Economy of American Trade Policy</u>. Univ. Chicago Press, 1996. Argues that protectionist trade measures often protect only those industries with powerful lobbies. Case studies of seven industries and analysis of effects of anti-dumping laws are presented. Issues related to automobile, steel, semiconductor, lumber, wheat, textile and apparel industries are addressed.
- McGee R.W. <u>A Trade Policy for Free Societies: the Case Against Protectionism</u>. Quorum Books, 1994. Analysis of the view that trade deficits are irrelevant. Advocates repealing anti-dumping laws. Examines the monetary and nonmonetary costs of protectionism, and US and European trade policies and options.
- OECD. <u>Economic Surveys: United States.</u> OECD, 1993. Subjects addressed include macroeconomic policies; productivity and competitiveness; and, trade policy.
- Ready K.J. and Sandver M.H. "Policy Issues in Moving from NAFTA to the FTAA". North American Outlook, 5/6 pp. 24-25, Winter 1995/1996. Examines issues and processes for expanding the North American Free Trade Agreement to cover the western hemisphere under the proposed Free Trade Area of the Americas regional trading agreement. Includes a review of trade agreements and trade policies now in place in Latin America, the Caribbean, and North America.
- Reynolds C.W., Waverman L. and Bueno G. eds. <u>The Dynamics of North American Trade and Investment: Canada, Mexico and the United States</u>. Stanford, California: Stanford University Press, 1991. A collection of fourteen essays on issues related to regionalism and trilateralism. The volume sets the agenda for research and policy analysis in these issues. The volume provides a comprehensive coverage of these issues.

Research and Policy Committee of the Committee for Economic Development. <u>Breaking New Ground in U.S. trade Policy: A Statement.</u> Boulder, Colorado: Westview Press, 1991. A group of top US business leaders presents analyses and recommendations on a wide range of trade policy issues with special focus on three areas - unfair trade, multilateralism and foreign investment. It is a recommended read for both experts and non-specialists.

Rugman A. and Verbeke A. Global Corporate Strategy and Trade Policy. New York: Routledge, 1990. Focuses on trade relations between Canada and the US. Analyzes the effects of Japanese multinational dominance, and the implications of European integration.
