CANADIAN DELEGATES TO ECOSOC MEETINGS

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, announced today that Mr. Paul Tremblay, Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Canada to the United Nations, New York, has been named Canadian Delegate to the 37th Resumed Session of the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations (ECOSOC) to be held in New York on March 1 and to the 38th Session of the Economic and Social Council to be held from March 22 to 26, 1965. Mr. Mervin Gelber, Member of the House of Commons for York South, Ontario, will be the Alternate Delegate to the 38th Session of the Council.

Canada was elected by the General Assembly of the United Nations on February 10, 1965 for a fourth three-year term from 1965-68, to the 18 member state Council of ECOSOC. The Council is responsible for United Nations activity in the economic and social fields and is the counterpart of the Security Council which deals with United Nations political questions.
