PRAYERS.

Mr. Pepin, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copy of Order in Council P.C. 1970-959, dated June 2, 1970, with reference to a surtax on imported woven fabric shirts.—Sessional Paper No. 7/29.

Mr. MacEachen, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of Report entitled "A Projection of Manpower Requirements by Occupation in 1975—Canada and its Regions". (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 4/67.

Mr. Stanfield, from his place in the House, asked leave under Standing Order 26 to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a specific and important matter requiring urgent consideration and stated the subject to be; the impelling duty upon the government to give leadership by announcing forthwith a program of measures designed to complement and to offset the disadvantages consequential upon the unpegging of the Canadian dollar from a fixed exchange rate; that is, a program that will counteract the increasing difficulties faced by Canadian exporters and primary producers, the increasing difficulties faced by our domestic producers in the Canadian market, the undoubted resulting increase in unemployment; and, essentially a program that, by its immediate announcement, will ease the confusion among Canadians as to the financial and economic direction of the Canadian government.
