RECOVERY OF LOSSES FOR SMALL COMPANIES

Question No. 5,751—**Mr. Herbert:**

Is any consideration being given to providing financial compensation for those small companies who have lost considerable sums of money from the manufacture of large quantities of non resaleable material for Indian nuclear reactors?

Mr. Marcel Roy (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce): Yes. Until very recently negotiations with the Government of India were continuing and there was a possibility that Canadian manufacturers might recover some of their losses through a resumption of deliveries. Following the May 18, 1976 decision to terminate nuclear cooperation with India, the government is giving active consideration to requests from industry for compensation to cover losses for undelivered equipment and materials. Export permits for these goods were suspended on May 22, 1974 following the explosion of a nuclear device by India.

CRIMINAL CODE

MEASURES RESPECTING PUNISHMENT FOR MURDER AND OTHER SERIOUS OFFENCES

The House resumed from Thursday, July 8, consideration of Bill C-84, to amend the Criminal Code in relation to the punishment for murder and certain other serious offences, as reported (with amendment) from the Standing Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs and motion No. 36 (Mr. Stevens) and motion No. 37 (Mr. Fortin).

Mr. Speaker: Order. We are now considering motions Nos. 36 and 37, but there are certain points of order on other motions, specifically those moved by the hon. member for Lotbinière (Mr. Fortin), that is motions Nos. 26, 27, 30, 31, 33, 41 and 43.

The hon. member for Lotbinière has indicated that he wishes to withdraw the motions.

The hon. member for Lotbinière.

Mr. André Fortin (Lotbinière): Mr. Speaker, the following procedure would be the easiest: instead of withdrawing the motions, since they are valid, they should be passed or defeated as a whole on division as they were last evening.

I should like to indicate, in respect of the motions I have just enumerated, that the Chair would have the greatest difficulty in finding such motions procedurally acceptable at this time.
