NATIONAL NATIVE ALCOHOL ABUSE PROGRAM

Question No. 3,272—Mr. Manly:

1. What are the salary scales for counsellors in the alcohol and drug abuse program under Indian Health Services in the Department of National Health and Welfare?

2. What was the estimate for expenditures for the program, nationally and by province?

3. What amount was actually spent by the program in each of the past five years, nationally and by province?

**Hon. Monique Bégin (Minister of National Health and Welfare):** 1. Counsellors in the National Native Alcohol Abuse Program (NNAAP) are not public servants, and therefore, do not have a salary scale, as some 50 groups in the public service have. Salaries are established in some cases by NNAAP regional advisory board, and in others, rates of reimbursement of these workers are established by individual alcohol abuse projects. Generally, their salary ranges from \$11,500 to \$16,700.

2. For FY 81/82, Treasury Board authorized a total of \$8.304 million for the program. This amount is subdivided into a contribution and an operating allotment, and (with the exception of salaries for the national office of the alcohol abuse program, which is charged to the Department of National Health and Welfare) is cost-shared equally between the Department of National Health and Welfare and the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, as per table.

Order Paper Questions

The distribution of funds to regions and the national office for FY 81/82, broken down into operating and contributions allotments is shown in table.

3. The amount actually spent by the program in each of the past five years, nationally and by regions is as shown in table.
