As Your Honour knows, I gave notice earlier today of my intention to move a motion under the provisions of Standing Order 30, concerning a subject of great importance which is recognized by all the Parties in the House, namely, the invasion of Grenada. I know that by the time we finish the second vote it will be past six o'clock so I am asking if we can obtain the unanimous consent of the House to have the Chair make its ruling on that motion after we take the next vote.
