## MESSAGE FROM THE KING

Mr. Speaker: I have the honor of informing the House  
that His Majesty the King has been pleased to command that  
the following Message be sent to the House of Commons:

Bill C-23,  
An act to authorize General Security Assurance Company of Canada to be continued in a corporation under the laws of the province of Quebec.

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the continuance of the General Security Assurance Company of Canada, and for other purposes connected therewith;

And whereas it is expedient to make such other and further provision as may be necessary for the carrying into effect of the purposes of this Act;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons, enacts as follows:

## THE ROYAL ASSENT

That the Royal Assent is given to and takes effect as follows:
