shall not exceed \$430,000,000 and shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund; to provide for transitional matters in the manner prescribed in respect of payments to eligible importers for import compensation; and to provide in the manner prescribed out of moneys appropriated by Parliament for petroleum supplies transfer compensation in respect of petroleum to defined suppliers.

The following bill from the Senate was read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House:

Bill S-8, An Act respecting the use of national safety marks in relation to motor vehicle tires and to provide for safety standards for certain motor vehicle tires imported into or exported from Canada or sent or conveyed from one province to another.—Mr. Marchand (Langelier).

Ordered,—That at 2.00 o'clock p.m., the House shall revert to "Motions".

Bill C-31, An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money for the public service for the financial year ending 31st March, 1975, was again considered in Committee of the Whole and progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again later this day.

Pursuant to Order made earlier this day the House reverted to "Motions".

Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of an Agreement on an International Energy Program, done at Brussels, September 27, 1974.—Sessional Paper No. 301-6/15.

By unanimous consent, it was ordered,—That the Agreement on an International Energy Program, done at Brussels, September 27, 1974, Tabled this day, be referred to the Standing Committee on National Resources and Public Works for consideration and report back to the House.

The House resumed consideration in Committee of the Whole of Bill C-31, An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money for the public service for the financial year ending 31st March, 1975, which was reported, without amendment, concurred in at the report stage, read the third time and passed.
