

AN ICE MOUNTAIN AT THE FOOT OF AMERICAN FALL.—It was an exceptionally cold winter that produced the remarkable ice formation photographed above. The base of the mountain is cakes of ice that, having become detached above, come tumbling over the brink and gradually accumulate as the apray freezes as it falls upon them. Thereafter, the weather continuing severe, the mountain increases rapidly until it reaches more than half the height of the catarate, providing vantage points for visitors to observe more closely the grandest thing in nature.
