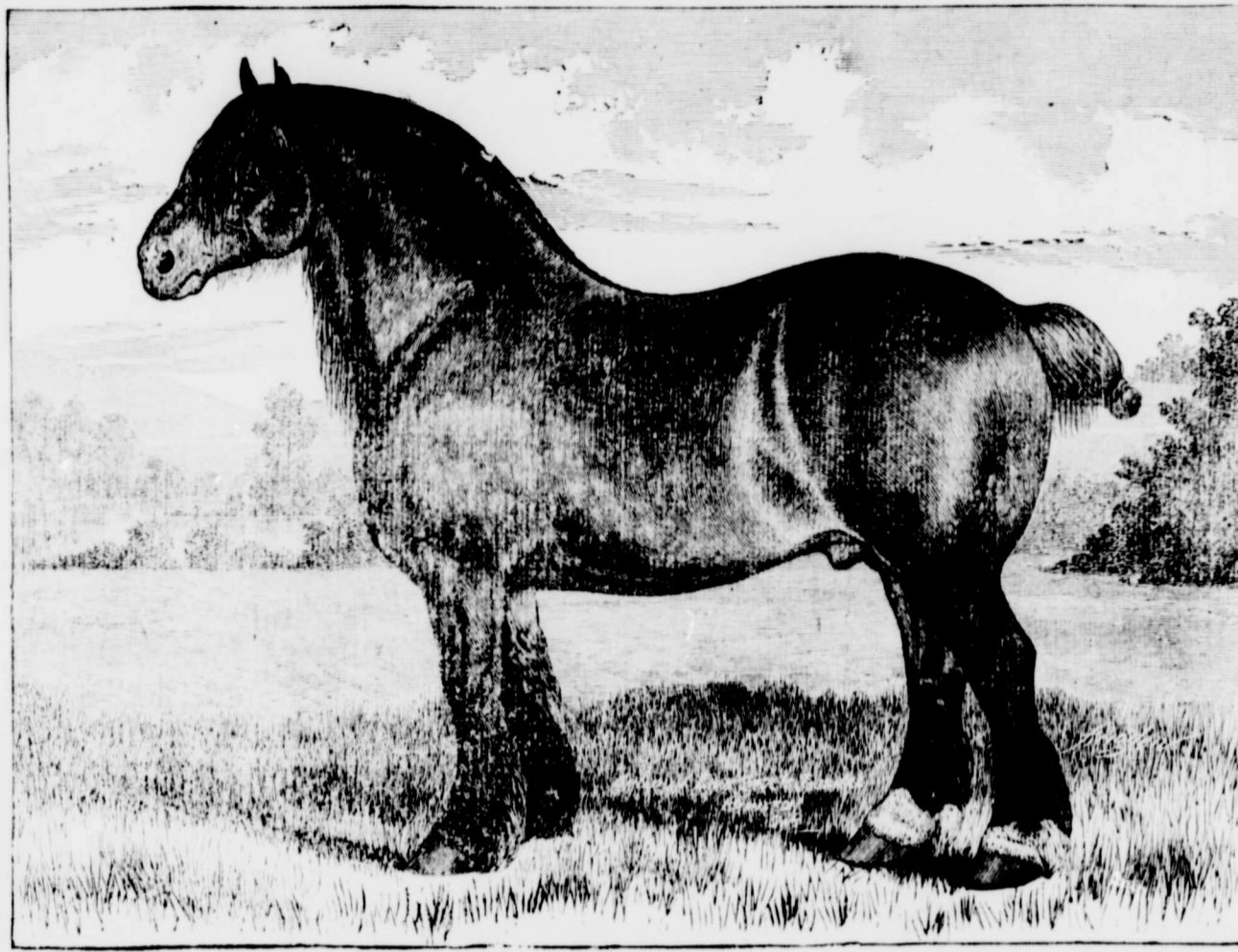

INGRAM'S HEIR

A PRIZE WINNER AT THE WORLD'S FAIR.

(Recorded in Vol. VII., American Clydesdale Stud Book.) Will serve mares for the season of 1900 as follows:

MONDAY, May 7, will leave his own stable, Maple Grove, and proceed to A. E. Rundle's, Ebenezer, night.

TUESDAY, proceed to his own stable.

WEDNESDAY, proceed to John Robbins', Hampton, noon; thence to Joseph Hawkey's, Tyrone, night.

THURSDAY, proceed to Orono, night.

FRIDAY, proceed to Bennett's Hotel, Newcastle, night.

SATURDAY, proceed to Bennett House, Bowmanville, noon; thence to his own stable, where he will remain until the following Monday.

The above route will be continued during the season, health and weather permitting.
