He might possibly add, that tall these Circumstances were not equally true with Respect to Ireland, that the Irish were of a different Race, that they were another People, and of a different Ringdom! It is unnecessary to observe, how very inconclusive the Arguments drawn from Analogy are generally found to be; to observe the resemblance without taking Notice of the Difference betwixt any two Things can tend but little to the Discovery of Truth.
