A "Scrap" Iron Commission.

Before the House adjourned Premier Ross rose to announce the decision of the Government with regard to the assessment bills now before the House. The Government had considered the fact that for many years the Assessment Act had been growing cumbrous, and there had gradually grown into it an abundance of anomalies. It was the duty of the Government to consider these facts, and it had been decided that the best mode of giving proper consideration to so important a subject was by the appointment of a royal commission, composed of five or seven capable men, men of municipal experience, men capable of dealing with large questions in a judicious and practical way. There was an Assessment Act in each province of the Douinion, and something might be learned by Ontario from her sister provinces. Something might also be learned from the neighboring States of the union. It was in the interest of the whole province that the Government should deal with this question in a comprehensive way. He, therefore, proposed that the different bills looking to amendment of the Assessment Act now before the House be allowed to stand until the report of the Royal Commission should be brought down.
