THREE DELEGATES INJURED

Serious Railway Collision Occurred Yesterday Morning at Stuart Street Station Hamilton.

SEMAPHORES INVISIBLE IN FOG.

Arthur Woodworth's Foot Was Badly Crushed That Amputation Was Necessary.

Hamilton, Feb. 25.—A serious collision took place about 9 o'clock this morning at the Stuart street station, Grand Trunk, resulting in two young men being injured, a number of passengers shaken up and the rolling stock being badly damaged. There were at the time on the principal track the westbound accommodation train and the Toronto train. The Lobligh Valley express, having on board many student volunteers going to the Toronto Convention, had been divided into two sections. The first section arrived and was sent on safely. The second section followed about 15 minutes later, while the two trains remained were waiting to leave.

After his injuries were dressed he was able to go to his hotel.

ing to those of other churches. It would be difficult, therefore, to place the representatives of the various churches on the table of precedence. Under consideration.

"I may say, Sir, that I have proceeded, that all these difficulties have been looked into by the government. At the time of the visit, the Prime Minister there were very serious complaints from some eminent divines of the dissenting churches in this and other cities. They complained very much of the fact that they had been ignored, and had not been extended the courtesy which was extended to the dignitaries of other churches. A sub-committee of the council has been appointed to look into the matter and prepare a report. It is now under the consideration of the council. The investigation. When we come to the point of framing a table of precedence, the difficulty is almost insurmountable. But we are doing our best to overcome that difficulty. I would be very much obliged, indeed, if the members of this House would give us the benefit of their views as to what table of precedence we should adopt. It is His Majesty the King. At the present time, the members of the House are in the dark, and we have no right to arrive at a solution which we would like to recommend to the House. The moment the government makes proper representation to the House, we will immediately be accepted to."

Democratic Dr. Sprague.

Dr. Sprague would do to do away with all precedence. Mr. D. C. Fraser, Hear, hear. For my own part, I am in favor of the question of precedence. I have 30 orders in the table of precedence, and I am in favor of only coming in the 24th place. Personally I do not think the clergy should be recognized as a profession or territory, and numbering in all 149. The rank of the population (4,180) is classed as unspecified, more than one-half of them being in the unorganized territories.
