Such is Decision of the Federated Council—Conference This Evening.

Whereas the Builders' Exchange have, within recent times, been federated to take concerted action as a body in all questions connected with the building line, and whereas the masons' section of the Builders' Exchange voted to grant the builders' laborers an advance of two cents per hour, and whereas the federated body voted against the adoption of the report, thus forcing a strike by the builders' laborers against the bosses who pay the wages had signified their willingness to pay an advance; be it

Resolved, by this building trades' section that we recognize the full significance of this move on the part of the bosses, and to counteract this movement, we recognize the absolute necessity, in the event of its continuance, of acting more and more as a united body, and declare that under present conditions, we will give all aid necessary to the builders' laborers to win their strike for a living wage.
