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INITIAL MEETING OF GRAND ARMY OF CANADA ORGANIZED

Organizer W. J. Carmichael Addresses Large Gathering at Hyman Hall.

FOUNDED LAST NOVEMBER

All Men and Women in Uniform During the War Eligible.

An organization meeting of local men and women who have worn the King's uniform at any time was held in Hyman Hall last night, when W. J. Carmichael, Dominion organizer of the Grand Army of Canada, addressed those present and outlined the aims and objects of this body. At the conclusion of his remarks questions pertaining to the Grand Army of Canada were answered by the organizer, and several members were enrolled for a new post in the headquarters in London, and which is to be the thirteenth post in Canada.

Those Eligible.
The following are eligible for membership in the Grand Army of Canada, which has Dominion headquarters at Toronto: All men and women who have been in uniform during the present war, the pay-roll of the Government for duty in Canada and the United States; also in England, France and any other theatre of war. Also all who have an honorable discharge from his majesty's army and navy, and those who have served in the colonial forces in former campaigns. Also all soldiers and sailors who have served in the Allied forces in this war are eligible for membership.

The above organization was founded November 11, 1918, the reason given by the speaker last night being the fact that no other soldier body in Canada reserves the right to enter independent candidates in the political field, and the Grand Army of Canada will in the near future form a political party in the Dominion, and will endeavor to elect representatives to power who will give justice to the men who served during the war. Constitution of this body for its affiliation with any political party, but the speaker asserted that the Grand Army would work hand-in-hand with other soldier organizations in Canada for the improvement of living conditions.

Demand Pensions.
Absolute abolition of patronage and equalization of pensions are demanded by this soldier body, as is also preference over foreigners in employment, and that no alien enemy be allowed to enter Canada for many years. A fourth demand is that the returned man have the preference in Dominion employment. The organization is not allowed, under its constitution, to take any free money, grant or gratuity from any government, political party, council or corporation, asking no favors from politicians. In return the Grand Army will give them no favors.

The badge of this association is loaned to all members in good standing, and the completion of the badge form. The Grand Army of Canada weekly journal is published every Monday and keeps the viewpoint of the returned soldier before the public.

The motto of the Grand Army of Canada is, "We Shall Not Break Faith." A meeting will likely be held in this city in the near future, when the members enrolled last night will elect officers of the local post for the ensuing year.
