## PIN THESE FACTS UP ON WALLS OF YOUR HOME

**Conditions and Terms of World's Contest Repeated For Information of the Public—The One Important Point.**

In case that there may still be some doubt as to what The World's \$15,000 contest means, how the prizes are to be obtained, how the ballots count and what voting may be done the following facts are repeated. ## Conditions of Contest.

Contest closes Sept. 10 next at midnight.

Third—Roadster, \$1000.

Fourth—Motor boat, \$800.

Fifth—European tour, \$600.

Six—Twelve district prizes of splendid pianos, value \$350 each.

Seven—Twelve district prizes of diamond rings at \$75 each.

Eight—Twelve vacations trips at \$75 each.

Nine—Twelve solid gold watches at \$50 each.

Ten—Any man or woman (married or single), girl or boy, is eligible to compete.

Eleven—Toronto is divided into seven districts, and the province into four districts, excluding Hamilton, which is a district by itself.

Twelve—Votes cast for candidates in one district have no bearing whatever upon the number of votes cast for candidates in other districts, except so far as the grand prizes are concerned.

Thirteen—The grand prizes are awarded according to the contestants receiving the greatest number of votes respectively.

Fourteen—Nominations of Candidates.

Every candidate must be regularly nominated in writing on the blank form printed in The World or on a similar blank printed by The World.

Fifteen—No candidate is permitted to trans-

fer votes to another after voting for him or herself.

Sixteen—Ballots sent in for names not nominated will be destroyed uncounted.

Seventeen—All paid-in-advance subscriptions must be sent direct to the contest department of The Toronto World and upon receipt of remittance a special ballot will be issued.

Eighteen—A contestant living in one district is not permitted from securing subscriptions or votes in another district, as special ballots will be issued with paid-in-advance subscriptions secured anywhere in Canada, United States or Great Britain.

Nineteen—The Important Feature.

Twenty-two—Prize Chickens Buried.

Fire at the yesterday morning in the Parkdale Poultry Yard, owned by Henry Dunn, at 56 Garden-avenue, damaged those premises to the extent of \$1000. A large number of valuable birds, including the famous hen Superba, and other prize Minorcas, valued at \$800, were destroyed. Superba alone was valued at \$100. It is thought that the fire was caused by an explosion of a lamp under a breeder.

Twenty-three—Big Reward For Bandits.

Chief of Police Grasett has received notification of a reward of \$10,000 offered for the arrest of each of six men who a few days ago held up and robbed a Great Northern train at Morse siding, four miles from Hillary, Wash., when the registered mail containing many thousands of dollars, was stolen. It is thought that the men may have come to Canada.
