WEATHER FEATURES OF THE PAST MONTH

Very Changeable--Precipitation in Ontario Supernormal -Early Navigation.

The Government Meteorological office in Toronto sends out the following report of the weather conditions that prevailed during April:

Temperature. The mean temperature for April was above average from the Thunder Bay district of Ontario to the Rocky Mountains, whilst elsewhere in Canada it was subnormal. In southern districts of the western provinces, positive departures of 3 degrees were general, while over a large portion of Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime Provinces, the negative difference from average was more than 3 degrees, and in the Ottawa Valley was from 5 degrees to degrees.

Precipitation. The amount of precipitation recorded during April was much less than average from British Columbia to Eastern Manitoba except very locally in Alberta, where the fall was slightly in excess of the normal; while in Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime Prov-
