THE BIG LEAGUES

Surprises Were Numerous in Major Leagues

Leading Teams Lose

Cleveland Noses Washington Out of Sixth Place; Red Sox Badly Beaten by St. Louis; Giants Win Another and Make it Nine Straight; Braves Lose Great Game to Cubs

Surprises were numerous in both major leagues. Yesterday, the Phillies and Braves were triumphed in the National League and Detroit and Boston in the American. As a result both races have become more uncertain and what the final result will be time alone can tell. In the National League Brooklyn gained several points on their nearest competitors, the Phillies and Braves, as a result of a victory over the Pirates, while in the American League, Boston and Detroit both dropped and the Chicago White Sox gained. Only five points separate the Red and White Sox and two points the leaders and the Tigers. Never before in the history of baseball were races at this stage of the game so close and uncertain.

As a result of an easy victory over the Philadelphia team, Cleveland nosed Washington out of sixth place. The Red Sox did not look much like champions in their game against St. Louis yesterday. Four hits and four errors will never win a game or a pennant.

The Giants are certainly finishing strong, but it looks as if their spirit came too late. "Perez and Peritt" are pitching well and aided by hitting the team has won their ninth straight. One often recalls about the advantage the Phillies have on their home grounds owing to the chance to drive home runs into the right field bleachers, but no reference is ever made to the fact that the visiting teams have that same privilege if they are able to do so. Yesterday Bescher of the St. Louis team connected with a fast one when three men were on base and the short field cost the home team the game.

The Braves put up a great game against the Cubs, but the breaks went against them in the eleventh and they lost.
