Paris, June 19—"Duke" Mullins, who fitted Jack Johnson for his fight with Tommy Burns, is training the Australian boxers who have entered the inter-allied games, which begin on June 24. He has some likely heavyweights with him, among them being Captain Gordon Coghlin, champion boxer of the British army, and Harold, the amateur champion of the National Club of London, in 1910, who fought Eddie McGoorty and Les Darcy.

The Australian wrestlers are headed by Billy Miske, heavyweight champion of Australia, and Alf Taylor, British representative at the Olympic games at Stockholm, will compete as a lightweight.
