

APPEAL FOR AID OF Y.M.C.I. IS MADE

Letter Asking Support is Read From Catholic Pulpits

A letter from the directors of the Young Men's Catholic Institute, urging support from all the Catholic population of the city, was read in the Catholic churches of the city yesterday.

The letter appealed particularly for support by the congregations of the coming exhibition of the physical classes which will be held late this month, and it was announced that a strong committee representing the Catholic women's societies of the city was co-operating in the sale of tickets.

A strong appeal was made to the men of the parish in the Cathedral yesterday to join in greater numbers the Holy Name Society. It was pointed out that there were 1,600 families in the parish and that if every family were represented, the roll of the society would contain at least 1,600 names.

The fact that 1,600 men would go to Holy Communion in a body on the second Sunday of every month would be an example to the parish and an object lesson to the city as a whole, it was said. An appeal was also made to the women to exert every effort to induce their husbands, sons and brothers to join the society.

Circus folk, says the New York Herald-Tribune, went to 233 Eighth avenue yesterday to say good by to a man who had once been one of their number. The saddest thing has ever happened to a circus man, and the Eight Avenue undertaking establishment has seen few such services as that held there yesterday.

It wasn't a service in the strict sense of the word. About 100 persons, many of them circus performers of the past or present and most of them friends of Billy Showles when he was a bareback rider with no superior, swarmed into the small funeral rooms and talked of Gilly Showles and heard a service read by the Rev. Dr. J. B. Wasson, of the Strangers' Welfare Fellowship.

The mourners talked of Billy and his exploits, of the many feats he had performed, of the many good deeds he had done, of the innumerable friends that he had won. It is a big hearted business, the circus business, and they recall that one of the biggest hearts of all belonged to Billy Showles. There were few flowers because they

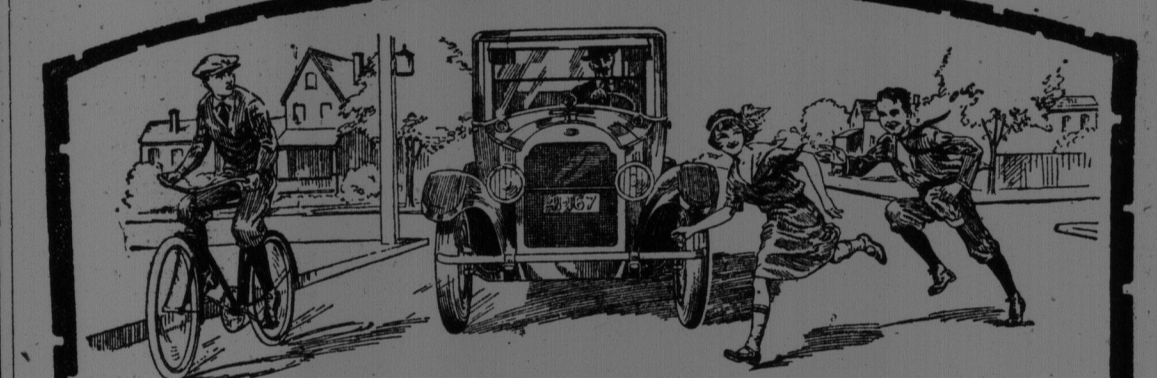

Cycling Safer Than Walking

A CHILD who suddenly darts out from the sidewalk into the road in a game of tag, or one who jumps from behind a standing vehicle, is far more likely to be run down by a motor car than a child on a bicycle.

In fact, Police Statistics show that cycling is safer than walking both for adults and for children. Take the City of Toronto, for example, where the traffic is as heavy and congested as in any place in Canada. The carefully kept records of the Toronto Police Department shows that out of a total of 2,173 accidents of various kinds in 1923, cyclists were only involved in 42, and 36 of these were cases of collisions of cyclists and pedestrians. There were practically no accidents between motorists and cyclists. Cycling in smaller cities and in the country is even safer than in Toronto.

There are good reasons why Cycling is Safe. A child on a bicycle has his attention on riding and watches traffic closely. A child on the sidewalk is very likely to engage in some game that makes him forget himself and run carelessly into the path of motor cars.
