Too Many in Public Life, Says Hamilton Man.

Hamilton, May 19—Lloyd Harris of Brantford, former Canadian trade commissioner in London, England, was the chief speaker at a banquet held in the Royal Connaught Hotel here. He said that Canada had lost opportunities for trade in Europe, and it was for her people to take advantage of the great name this dominion had won in Europe during the war and extend the country's trade as it should be done. It was not well to depend too much on the government in this matter, Mr. Harris said.

President Robert Hobson of the Steel Company of Canada, said if there were more men like Mr. Harris in Canada, there would not be rotten conditions which existed at present. There were too many spineless weak-kneed men in public life, Mr. Hobson said.

GETS DAMAGES FOR INJURIES RECEIVED WHEN CAR CRUSHED HIM

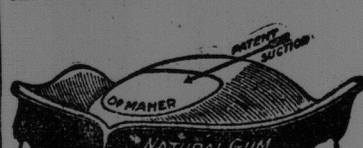
