The Library Committe report that in addition to the 153 volumes that are now worn out, they have selected and laid by 260 volumes for re-binding, and request the attention of the new Library Committee thereto as soon as practicable.

Every endeavour should be made to secure the return of books on the expiration of the time allowed for reading them. The cooperation of members and subscribers is particularly requested in this matter.

The only donation made to the Library during the year was by Mr. Norris Black, of one volume, entitled "Evidences of Christianity."
