London, Nov.16.—A pretty quarrel

many Liberal-Unionists would, in all
probability, reacht against the goverment. On the other hand, there is loud
talk of mutiny in the Tory ranks should
the bill be brought in, and, for the moment, at any rate, the goverment is between the devil and the deep sea.

led by Col. Saunderson, have never disguised their antipathy to the proposed
legislation, and most of them openly declare that they would rather have home
rule and take their chances in a Dublin
Parliament than be in the minority in
the numerous county councils which will

A GALLANT RESCUE.

BRAVE WORK BY LIFE-BOAT MEN. New York, Nov. 13.—A special to the cerald gives a graphic account of the allant efforts to rescue the crew of the

chean breach over the vessel. The mem-br of the life-boat crew, who was pa-colling the beach near where the "Ben-there" was dashed ashore, had seen the sull van Brothers, and one

trolling the beach near where the "Benvenue" was dashed ashore, had seen the lights of the ill-fated vessel, and immediately called upon his companions to hasten to the rescue of the imperilled crew. The life-boat was manned, cork jackets put on, the life lines rigged out, and then, with a hearty cheer, the gallant life savers ran their boat into the water, and, waiting for a favorable moment when she was in the embrace of an outgoing wave, jumped to their places, the oars dropped between the thole pins, the coxawain grasped the tiller ropes, and, with a long, steady sweep of the trusty oak blades, the life-boat started for the wreck. Togsed like a cockelshell upon the angry waves, the lifeboat rose and fell. At times she could be seen apparently climbing to the top of an enormous roller, then for a moment would remain perched upon the crest of the wave and then, with a headlong pitch, would disappear from view in the trongh of the sea. For a time she was and flying spume. When she again came in view the hardy watermen were seen ugallantly struggling against terrivile odds but determined, if such a thing were possible, to succeed in their herofo work of rescue. They finally approached the wreck, but the sea was running with such tremendous fury that it was impossible for them to get near enough to attempt to take off the men in the rigging.
