Increase of Over Eighty-One Millions Over Previous Year — Detailed Statement Shows Big Increase in Every Department — Trade by Decades.

OTTAWA, Ont., July 23.-Canada's | The returns for the year are as folforeign trade for the financial year that Imports ended June 30 last amounted to \$552,000, (for consumption). 1905. 1906. 000, which is an increase of over 81 Dutiable goods .\$150,914,668 \$173,027,710 millions over the previous year. This is far and away the best showing in the country's history, and a striking evidence of the unexampled prosperity that prevails in practically every branch of trade. The imports for consumption of \$290,342,408 represented an increase of \$28,440,973 over the record of the preceding twelve months.
