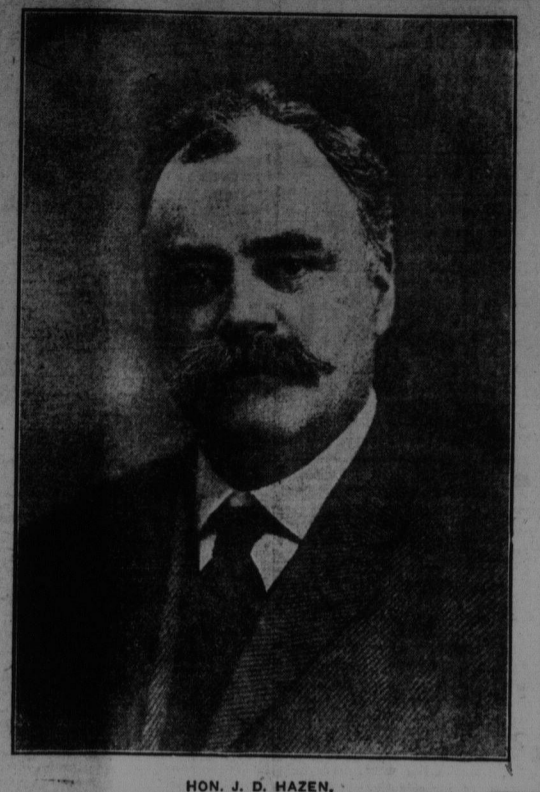

duce a substantial income, till from eleven to fifteen years the returns are running into four figures. The great advantage we have to offer to the settler from Great Britain who comes with small capital, but with some knowledge of farming, is this—that he has not only a healthful occupation to follow, but does not incur the risk inevitable from the cultivation of one crop. His eggs are not all in one basket, and if he gets a short crop of wheat he should make up the deficiency by his potatoes, or his stock, or his poultry. He is a country well served by railways, and in ready touch with the large markets of the world. Our climate is temperate, and healthy because it is temperate. The winter, which is not very rigorous, is usually very even, and lasts for about four and a half months, is almost immediately followed by summer. The value of our summers to the faded city dweller who is in quest of bracing yet healthy breezes is so well known that at this season our hotels and summer camps are thronged by visitors from the big cities of Canada and America.

Feast Days and Fast Days. An interesting feature of a decree recently issued by Pope Pius X., says the Montreal Gazette, is that for the future, if a feast day of a patron saint here that for a license of \$10, and a small cost of a passage from England, moose, caribou, and deer shooting may be enjoyed.
