At the close of the session of the House of Commons, and before the adjournment, Mr. Lloyd George said he was doing his utmost to prevent the premature publication of allegations which were being made against the officers concerned. The affair had been investigated by the late Field Marshal and Commander-in-Chief, Lord Kitchener, Premier Asquith and himself, he added, and he was seeking to protect the honor of our young Irishmen by continuing the investigation in the most impartial manner.
