London, May 10.—Midnight. The bill passed to a second reading in the House of Lords after a large vote of 86 against 56.

Granville will make a statement to-day in the House of Lords with regard to the negotiations for amendment of the Treaty of Washington.

Amendment to the French army bill reducing the terms of military service from five to four years, was rejected in the Assembly yesterday, 596 to 495.

New York 11. Congress adjourned without date at nine o'clock last evening, after a violent debate on the addition of the Enforcement Act to the Omnibus Appropriation Bill, which was carried by a strict party vote.

Granville now wants the United States Government to join with that of Great Britain in asking the Geneva Board of Arbitration to adjudge of eight months, and proposes unless this be accomplished, to withdraw from the Arbitration. To this proposition our Government refuses to assent.

The President leaves Washington to-day with his family for Long Beach, and large number of members of Congress leave for home.
