Took an active part in the organization of the English Volunteer Force and also in military organization. Retired in 1875 with the rank of Lieut-Col. Was Private Secy. to the Duke of Westminster from 1870-74. Is author of *Turkey in Europe* and several works on army organization. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Conservative. Believes in encouragement and assistance to *bona fide* settlers and mining proprietors; liberal expenditure on Public Works of assured utility; loyalty to the Dominion and Federation of the British Colonies.—*Cranbrook, Kootenay, B. BOLE, WILLIAM NORMAN, Q.C. (*New Westminster City.*)

Descended from an old Surrey family which emigrated to Ireland in 1520. Eldest s. of the late John Bole, Esq., of Lakefield, Mayo, Irel., for many years Deputy Clerk of the Crown and Peace for Mayo. B. at Castlebar, 6 Dec., 1848. M., 26 Feb., 1881, Florence Blanchard, dau. of J. H. Coulthard, J. P., of New Westminster. Ed. by private tuition and at Santry Public Sch. Is a Barrister-at-Law, and J. P. and has been Police and Stipendiary Magistrate for New Westminster. Apptd. Q.C., 7 June, 1888. Is a dir. of the Royal Columbian Hospital, of which he was four years Presdt. Was Lieut. in the Seymour Field Battery from 1879 to 1882, and was Capt. in B. C. Brigade Garrison Artillery, V.M. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e.—*New Westminster, B. C.*

BEAVEN, ROBERT. (*Victoria City.*)

S. of the late Rev. James Beaven, D.D., Prof. of Divinity, King's Coll., Toronto, and subsequently Prof. of Metaphysics and Ethics, Toronto Univ. B. a Leigh, Staffordshire, Eng., 28 Jan., 1836. Ed. in Toronto, settled in B.C., April, 1862. M., May, 1866, Susan, dau. of the Rev. Canon Ritchie, of Georgina, Ont. A merchant. Was a mem. of Ex. Council and Chief Commr. of Lands and Works from Dec., 1872, until the resignation of the Walkem
