Debbie captures collegiate event

Pan American Games gold medalist pentathlete Debbie Van Kiekelbeert recorded her first long jump triumph of the indoor track and field season last Saturday.

The 19-year-old Clarkson girl, a first-year student at York University, leaped six metres (19 feet 7 inches) to capture the Ontario Universities Athletic Association (O.U.A.A.) championship crown.

Debbie was the most successful but not the only Mississauga athlete in the spotlight of the O.U.A.A. meet.

Freshmen Bob deGroot, Applewood Secondary School's most valuable athlete last year, turned in a notable 5.7-second effort to finish a close second in the men's 50-metre dash.

DeGroot is now a student at the University of Toronto.
