have been uniformly to better things than if they had continued with the D.S.C.R.

This would dispose of 23 of those 41 cases, but it will be noted that Dr. Mathews and Dr. Brown figure in two of these classes -- thus, leaving a net disposal of 21 of those 41 cases referred to by Dr. Arnold.

As to the remaining 20 cases let us consider those nine medical officials who, as above, were reduced from full time to part time. The facts now show that of those nine doctors, the only ones who had occasion to complain and still compalain of political partisanship are known Liberals (3) Dr. Gunn, Dr. Elliott, and Dr. MacBeth.

The arrangement fro half time with the other six of that class of doctors fell-in with their own advantage, it will be noticed, from the above outline of their respective professional careers.

Next in order for consideration are four Liberal doctors, namely Dr. Wellwood, Dr. James, Dr. R.W. Halliday, Dr. R.W. Wallace. Omitting from thes four, Dr. Wellwood; whose case is admittedly special; we have three cases more of Liberal doctors who protested against being dismissed from the D.S.C.R.

Of the remaining medical official retirements either total or to part-time to be considered, there are seven cases - Dr. Roswell, (Conservative) Dr. Pearson, (Understood to be Conservative) Dr. Boyer, (Conservative) Dr. Spohn, (Liberal) Dr. Aylesworth (Liberal)
