

Ottawa, Nov. 11, 1912.

Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 6th instant and to inform you that the Canadian Pacific Railway Company has not withdrawn its application to lease or purchase the land in the Lower French River Indian Reserve referred to in the letter to you of the 30th ultimo.

In your letter of Sept. 17, last, you stated that this land had, on consultation with the Indians, been valued at \$40.00 per acre. The railway company, however, desire a lease as stated in our said letter of the 30th ultimo. Please state as requested in said letter what rental should be charged the company.

The John Harrison & Sons Company has made application direct to the Department for a portion of land in the said reserve which said portion includes ^{said} the land previously applied for by the Canadian Pacific railway. It is intended to deal with the application of the Canadian Pacific Railway first.
