
Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 2nd instant, in regard to application of Mary Jane McPherson for an allotment of land on the St. Peters Indian reserve, in accordance with the conditions of the surrender of the said reserve.

In reply I beg to say that since writing you on the 14th instant, this matter has been looked into, and in view of the fact that the land on this reserve has been all allotted, it is not possible to have an allotment made, as requested.

I may say that it was understood that allotment was made some years ago under the terms of the surrender, to all members of the Band entitled to receive land.
