Address of the House of Assembly, the Lieutenant Governor from Her Majesty's Minister at Washington, re: the United States of America, as he considers him-

Toronto, 22nd October, 1838.*

8th instant, I had the honor to receive your Excellency's communication for the Invasion of this Province, is indeed the information which have reached me from other quarters,

than the statements which your Excellency had made, you will perceive that the information they contain, is indeed, there are many other statements before me of the same nature.

Major-General Macomb, earnestly requesting him to prevent the arms of the Brigands; which is inevitable, unless decisive measures be taken with promptitude and vigour. I have therefore taken other steps as are within his power, to avert the danger from the Province of Canada.

The Government the solemn obligation they are under to prevent invasions from being carried on upon the frontier.

It has been brought to Cleveland, to take part in this enterprise, who are still in a savage state; and that a large number of American Citizens appear to have been seduced.

The Government of the United States should supply the necessary assistance; and I do trust, that in Her most gracious Majesty's name, she will so do.

Major-General Macomb, (who has been sent to Major-General Macomb,) contains the same information of conspiracy, and then immediate arrest might have a great effect.

In the event of a calamity, I have called out a Militia force to oppose such an enemy; and if it must come, I will be glad to see an effective one, to deliver the country from such a calamity.

The Government of the United States respecting apprehended invasions of the Canadian Territory, and which are communicated to me, are fully confirmed by intelligence conveyed to Her Majesty's Ministers; and I am sorry to add, that the mischief is increasing, and the danger of hostile disturbance more imminent, than I have before stated.

It is also reported that a secret combination or conspiracy, of vast extent, for the purpose of carrying into effect military provisions, has been formed, and is at this time in progress.
