The Ladies' League placed on the offertory on Easter Day for the Women's Pier \$1025, which has since been increased to \$1060. The Children's offerings for their Pier were also presented, the amount being \$79.72. This makes the fund up to \$3250.

In his sermon on Easter Day, Canon Macnab spoke very strongly on the subject of "Rolling away the Stone" of debt from the Cathedral, and suggested the adoption of a form of intercession to be used throughout the Diocese, praying for Divine aid and relief. It is hoped that so excellent a suggestion will not be allowed to pass unnoticed.

The Confirmation is appointed to take place on Wednesday evening, 13th May, at 8 p.m. when it is expected that there will be an unusually large number of candidates. This will be the last service to be held here by the Archbishop prior to his departure for the Pan-Anglican Conference. He leaves on the 14th.

It is not so many years ago that the site of the Cathedral was selected, and was strongly criticised as being far too remote; yet we have arrived at a time when a site for a public institution having been selected near Yage Street has been so strongly objected to that it has been abandoned, the objectors insisting that a central site should be secured, which, in a public discussion on the subject, was declared by one speaker to be in the neighbourhood of St. Alban's Cathedral.
