THE PROPER WAY TO BIT A COLT.

Farmers often put a biting horse on a colt the first thing they do with him, bucking up the biting as tight as they can draw it, to make him carry his head high, and then turn him out in a lot to run half a day at a time.

A horse should be well accustomed to the bit before you put on the biting harness, and when you first bit him you should only run his head up to that point where he naturally holds it, but that is high or low, he will soon learn that he cannot lower his head, and that raising it at all will loosen the bit in his mouth.

The idea of raising his head to loosen the bit, and then you can draw the biting a little tighter every time you put it on, and he will raise his head to loosen it. By this means you will gradually get his head and neck in the position you wish him to carry it, and give him a graceful carriage, without hurting him, making him carry his head up to that point where he naturally holds it, but that is high or low, he will soon learn that he cannot lower his head, and that raising it at all will loosen the bit in his mouth.

There are three great advantages in having a block to mount from. First, a sudden change of position is very apt to frighten a horse who has never been handled. He will allow you to walk up to him and stand by his side without starting at you, because you have warned him to that position but if you get down on your hands and knees and crawl toward him, he will be very much frightened and upon the same principle he would frighten at your new position if you had the power to hold yourself over his back without touching him. Then if at the great advantage of the block is to gradually accustom him to that new position in which he will see you when you ride him.

Secondly, by the process of leaning your weight to the stirrups and on your hand, you can gradually accustom him to your weight, so as not to frighten him by having him feel it all at once. And, in the third place, the block elevates you so that you will not have to make a starting in order to get on the horse's back, but from it you can gradually raise yourself into the saddle.

Subsequent educational lessons in horse taming—how to subdue a kicking horse.
