This celebrated man, whose name will always remain identified with the secession of 1835, expired on Friday last, at his house in Manchester.

Shortly before midnight on Friday, the 23rd inst., the Rev. Samuel Warren, D.D., rector of All Souls', Essex-street, died at his residence in London.

Dr. Warren was a man of great strength of character and purpose, and deep and fervent piety, and exemplary in the discharge of his clerical duties.
